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Topic: Our response to injustices in the name of Islam

- Believers should have tender hearts that are filled with mercy.
- Any suffering should concern us, especially when it is endured by our brothers and sisters in faith.
- The actions of the oppressors do not go unnoticed by Allah. (Qur'an, 14:42)
- When injustices are committed in the name of Islam, we should all be especially concerned.
- Anas ibn Malik (may Allah be pleased with him) reported: The Messenger of Allah said, "Help your brother whether he is an oppressor or is being oppressed." It was said, "O Messenger of Allah, we help the one being oppressed but how do we help an oppressor?" The Prophet said, "By seizing his hand." (Recorded by Bukhari & Muslim)

عَنْ أَنَس رضى الله عنه قَالَ قَالَ رَسُولُ اللهِ صلى الله عليه وسلم انْصُرْ أَخَاكَ ظَالِمًا أَوْ مَظْلُومًا قَالُوا يَا رَسُولَ اللهِ هَذَا نَنْصُرُهُ مَظْلُومًا، فَكَيْفَ نَنْصُرُهُ ظَالِمًا قَالَ تَأْخُذُ فَوْقَ يَدَيْهِ
